## Child Care Providers Your Guide to New Crib Standards

Beginning **December 28, 2012**, any crib provided by child care facilities and family child care homes must meet new and improved federal safety standards. The new standards take effect for manufacturers, retailers, importers and distributors on **June 28, 2011**, addressing deadly hazards previously seen with traditional drop-side rails, requiring more durable hardware and parts and mandating more rigorous testing.

### What you should know...

- This is more than a drop side issue. Immobilizing your current crib will not make it compliant.
- You cannot determine compliance by looking at the product.
- The new standards apply to all full-size and non full-size cribs including wood, metal and stackable cribs.
- If you purchase a crib prior to the June 28, 2011 effective date and you are unsure it meets the new federal standard, CPSC recommends that you verify the crib meets the standard by asking for proof.
  - o Ask the manufacturer, retailer, importer or distributor to show a Certificate of Compliance. The document must:
    - Describe the product
    - Give name, full mailing address and telephone number for importer or domestic manufacturer
    - Identify the rule for which it complies (16 CFR 1219 or 1220)
    - Give name, full mailing address, email address and telephone number for the records keeper and location of testing lab
    - Give date and location of manufacture and testing
  - o The crib must also have a label attached with the date of manufacture

### What you should do...

- All child care facilities, family child care homes, and places of public accommodation:
  - o Must prepare to replace their current cribs with new, compliant cribs before December 28, 2012.
  - o Should not resell, donate or give away a crib that does not meet the new crib standards.
- Dispose of older, noncompliant cribs in a manner that the cribs cannot be reassembled and used.
- Noncompliant cribs should not be resold through online auction sites or donated to local thrift stores. CPSC recommends disassembling the crib before discarding it.

# Craft Corner

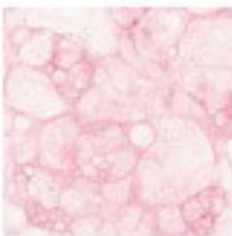
Normally, blowing bubbles with a drinking straw is taboo for kids. Not this time! In fact, that's half the thrill of making these marbled prints.

## Materials

- Store-bought or homemade bubble solution (see Step 2 for homemade recipe)
- Copier paper or light-colored construction paper
- Plastic drinking straws
- Newspaper or plastic tablecloth
- Several shallow disposable containers, such as aluminum pie tins

## Instructions

1. touch the paper to the bubbles and then lift to see your print, repeating until the paper is sufficiently covered. Blow more bubbles as needed. For a different effect, try printing one color over another.
2. Gather several shallow disposable containers, such as aluminum pie tins. In each, blend 1 cup of store-bought or homemade bubble solution with 1/2 cup of tempera paint. (To make your own bubble solution, mix 3 cups of water, 1 cup of dish soap, and 1/4 cup of corn syrup.)
3. Set out your paper (try copier paper or light-colored construction paper) and several plastic drinking straws. For younger children, pierce a small hole halfway up the straw with a pin; this will help prevent accidental swallowing of the paint but won't interfere with the bubble-blowing process.
4. Now for the fun. With one end of the straw submerged in the bubble solution, the kids blow until bubbles mound up in the container. The best time to take a print is just as the bubbles begin to overflow.
5. Gently touch the paper to the bubbles and then lift to see your print, repeating until the paper is sufficiently covered. Blow more bubbles as needed. For a different effect, try printing one color over another.

We ask that all members voluntarily provide a non-returnable copy of their child care license within 30 days of their child care license renewal date to the membership coordinator in order to receive the benefit of referrals, if a copy of your current license is not on file by that date your name will be taken off the referral list. We as the association provide referrals to licensed providers only. The association is trying to avoid a situation in which a parent holds the association responsible for providing a referral to a non-licensed provider. If ACAFCC membership coordinator has a current copy of your child care license at the time of membership renewal with ACAFCC you will not need to provide an additional copy of your child care license. You will ONLY need to supply a new copy at the time you receive your sticker from licensing. All new members need to submit a copy of their child care license with their membership application and then again on their license renewal date.
